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2. The details of the teaching demonstration and interview are as follows.

The demonstration teaching and interview will be held on **Monday, 29th March 2021, from 9.00 a.m.** onwards, at Sainampeung School.

1. The registration for the demonstration will be from 8.30 a.m. to 9.00 a.m. in room 442 (building 4 on the 4th floor). Any applicant who does not register during the specified time will be disqualified. The order of teaching demonstration will be according to the order of the registration.
2. The applicants must do the teaching demonstration for 20 minutes (choose certain parts from the lesson plan), followed by an interview session. The applicants can choose one of the two topics from the following given attachment (page 5 or 6) for the teaching demonstration.
3. The level of students will be grade 8th students (Mattayom 2);
Mini English Program.
4. A computer, speaker and projector are provided if needed.

3. Required documents

1. 3 copies of lesson plans (50-minute lesson plan) to the interviewers
2. Original credentials for any required documents (i.e., transcript, teaching license etc.)
3. Portfolio (if any)

4. Criteria

The accepted applicants must gainer 60 percent of the score based on the criteria for the teaching demonstration and interview. **The criteria for teaching demonstration is shown on page 3 and 4.**

LEARN THIS!

We use the present perfect

- To talk about recent events and to give news.
- With *for* to describe a period of time.
I've been here for 45 minutes.
- With *since* to describe a point of time.
I've been here since 2.30.
- In questions with *How long...?* to ask about the length of time of a current situation.
How long have you been here?

- Study the *Look out!* box. Find an example of *been* and *gone* in the postcard.

LOOK OUT!

been and gone

We usually use *have been* instead of *have gone*. We only use *have gone* when somebody has not yet returned. Compare:

I've been to Paris. Do you want to see my photos?
John isn't here. He's gone to Paris for the weekend.

Did you go to France last summer?

LOOK OUT!

present perfect and past simple

We often use the present perfect to ask and answer questions about an experience, and then the past simple to give more information about a specific occasion.

'Have you ever been to Japan?'

'Yes, I have. I went there last summer.'
